





# Sir Robert Peel

POLICE INSTITUTE



S ir Robert Peel (1788-1850), who served as Prime Minister of England twice, is remembered for many notable Acts of Parliament and policies. These include far-ranging criminal law and prison reform.

As British Home Secretary in 1829, Peel founded the London Metropolitan Police. He believed the key for policing is that, "the police are the public and the public are the police," Peel established nine principles of policing that are as relevant today as they were in the nineteenth century.

#### Peel's Nine Principles of Policing

- 1 "The basic mission for which the police exist is to prevent crime and disorder."
- 2 The ability of the police to perform their duties is dependent upon public approval
- 3 "Police must secure the willing co-operation of the public in voluntary observance of the law to be able to secure and maintain the respect of the public."
- 4 "The degree of co-operation of the public that can be secured diminishes proportionately to the necessity of the use of physical force."
- 5 "Police seek and preserve public favor not by catering to the public opinion but by constantly demonstrating absolute impartial service to the law."
- 6 Police use physical force to the extent necessary to secure observance of the law or to restore order only when the exercise of persuasion, advice and warning is found
- 7 "Police, at all times, should maintain a relationship with the public that gives reality to Police, at all times, should maintain a relationship with the public that gives reality to the historic tradition that the police are the public and the public are the police, the police being only members of the public who are paid to give full-time attention to duties which are incumbent on every citizen in the interests of community welfare
- 8 "Police should always direct their action strictly towards their functions and never ar to usurp the powers of the judiciary."


























#### **Unconsciousness**

Make sure they are laying on their side so they don't choke on vomit.



### **Breathing difficulties**

If there is no breathing or it is ineffective, then CPR should be attempted.



#### Seizures

Make sure the area is safe and there is nothing they could hurt themselves on.



#### **High temperature**

Cool them down by removing outer clothing, use a wet cloth on their skin.



### Severe chest pains

Sit them down in a calm environment and reassure them.



### Vomiting

Don't give them anything to eat and only let them drink water.



#### **Hallucinations**

Take them somewhere quiet where they feel safe. Monitor and call 111 if required



#### **Spice intoxication**


Monitor the person and call 111 if required








## Crimes and incidents within Cathedral area January 2017 - April 2019
